

# **POLICY HIGHLIGHT**

## **2023 GENERAL LEGISLATIVE SESSION PREVIE**

The 2023 General Legislative Session is only a few weeks away. Legislators meet for 45 days to pass policies that impact all Utahns – individuals, families, businesses, and organizations. We'll be on the Hill representing your needs and interests. Let's take a quick look at a few issues we expect to see.

### Water

It should come as no surprise that water is at the top of the list. As the one of the driest and fastestgrowing states in the nation, Utah's water resources and supply is top of mind for many. We expect to see legislation that deals with conservation, water systems and infrastructure, and continued efforts to save the Great Salt Lake.

## Tax Cuts

With an unprecedented budget surplus, we expect lawmakers to provide tax relief to Utahns. Tax relief could come in many shapes in forms – an income tax rate cut, an increase to the dependent exemption or social security, or other targeted cuts. We look forward to robust debates and supporting legislation that lowers taxes for Utahns.

## Housing

Utah's housing prices have skyrocketed in recent years, impacting many families and individuals. Lawmakers will look for ways to address this complicated problem.

## Education

Education is always top of mind for lawmakers. The Governor has proposed an increase to teacher compensation and we expect the Legislature to consider similar policies. There will likely be several bills proposing improvements to the education system, increases in funding, and safety measures.
